The routine proceedings of the International Council included as usual, words by 2008 President Norinaga Moriyama and 2009 President Dick Shick as well as the Secretary General's report, treasurer Clithertoe's report on the budget, the words of Vice president Seidemann, Immediate Past President Johnson, and Editor Hinterman's report. There was a morning working session on Tuesday October 14 followed by a 4 hour "Think tank" session in the afternoon, then a second working session on Wednesday morning.

The main subjects that were brought up were the following:

- The plans for a separation of the offices of the College-at-large from that of the USA Section due to take place in by December 31, 2009. The College will have a part-time Secretary General and a full time Executive Director.
- *Dues should be paid to the Central Office by end January of each year, and Induction fees within 2 months of the Induction of new fellows.*
- As head of the Strategic Planning Committee, Dr Steven Tonelli asked that **each Section have its own website with links to the College's web-site www.icd.org.**
- The Editor's report was lengthy and detailed and covered both the Globe and the International Electronic Newsletter. All Councilmen were asked to urge their sections to **work on finding advertisers for the Globe**A lot of time was spent also on detailing the excellent work that Dr Cecil Linehan is doing. Unfortunately, **distribution of the electronic newsletter seems to be incomplete** since it

depended on the sections having a full listing of e-mail addresses. **Our section was named as the one with the most complete list of e-addresses.**

- Some time was also spent on discussing attempts by the College to have a credit card issued to all fellows throughout the world. Use of this credit card by fellows would bring a certain revenue to the College. So far, efforts in this direction have been fruitless.
- Under “New Business” after the reading of the reports of all sections including ours, subjects ranging from the humanitarian help that South Korean ICD fellows were doing in North Korea, the need to improve the rosters of the sections, creating an ICD “Standards in Dentistry” program, and the work of the Search Committee in selecting a new Secretary General and an executive director.
